 A parishioner has offered to survey the junction and look for the possibility of an alternative layout Update to be given
- (b) (19.039) Update on correspondence received from MP's Office regarding the A59 The Clerk read out a letter from Howard Ferguson PA to MP Nigel Adams, who had been in touch with NYCC, who whilst they couldn't provide improvements required, they did undertake to monitor the Moor Monkton crossroads and report back. **Update to be given**

20.025 (19.088) Lancaster Bomber Memorial Stone – Update

- Correspondence received from Edlington resident and decision to be made.
 Cllr Tomlinson outlined the contents of the correspondence received from an
 Edlington resident and Edlington Town Council regarding the memorial
 plaque. Following discussion it was accepted by the Council, based on the
 evidence that Lancaster Bomber W4904 did crash at Cockhill Moor Monkton
 on 28th September 1943. Cllr Johnson proposed that we accept the Memorial
 Plaque from Edlington TC and this was seconded by Cllr Gibbs.
- Funding for Re-siting of Memorial Plaque and Remembrance Bench Cllr Johnson outlined that the VE 75 sub-committee had also been discussing the possibility of the Memorial Plaque coming to Moor Monkton and the Parish Council would match the Moor Monkton Village Association contribution of £250 towards the re-siting of the plaque.

Cllr Johnson proposed that the PC match MMVA's contribution of £250 and Cllr Gibbs seconded it. This is authorised under Section 137 of the Local Government Act 1972, which gives the Council the power to incur expenditure for purposes not otherwise authorised.

• Location of Plague to be decided?

When the Memorial Plaque becomes available to us it would be appropriate to have a rededication service, **Cllr Tomlinson proposed that it be re-sited in All Saints Church Yard, Moor Monkton and this was seconded by Cllr Johnson.**

- 20.026 (19.093) Hedge/Verge Cutting in the Village Update still required Action Point: Clerk to speak to TW to get an update
- 20.027 Responsibility for clearing Ditches and Drains within the Village
 Concerns were raised about the ditches not being cleared along the section of
 Marston Lane from A59 to the railway level crossing on both sides and this is
 considered to be the responsibility of the landowner.

 Action Point: Clerk to contact Landowners.
- 20.028 Landowner's Concerns of Dogs not on leads and not keeping to footpaths.

A farmer has complained that dogs are being let off leads and scaring his sheep and "Poo Bags" are being left in the hedgeways.

Action Point: Clerk to contact HBC Dog Warden and ask for any 'Dog Fouling' signs that can be laminated and put in strategic places.

20.029 Defibrillator on-going requirements

The Defibrillator has had new pads fitted in May and the battery is due for replacement in July. **Cllr Gibbs proposed we replace the battery in July and Cllr Tomlinson seconded the motion.** *Action Point: Cllr Gibbs to arrange.*

- **20.030 (19.093) VE Day Celebrations Friday 8th May 2020 Cancelled due to Coronavirus** Funding from the Parish Council for the Event **See Agenda Item 20.025** Following the cancellation of the event on the 8th May 2020, it was thought that the celebration could possibly be rearranged on 15th August, however this too has been cancelled due to the Corona virus crisis. The next planned beacon lighting event will be in 2022 for the Queen's platinum celebration.
- 20.031 To receive District and County Councillor's comments (if present).

Cllr Paraskos informed us that both NYCC and HBC were both working and using video for meetings. He explained that both councils have funding deficits mainly due to the additional spending on Covid 19 and they were uncertain if they would be fully reimbersed, as a consequence there is little money to spend on the highways. Cllr Paraskos also added that he had had his budget and allocated some of it for spending on lighting at the A59 junction with Church Lane, Moor Monkton, he was going to check to see what had been done and what costs would be involved, also in getting 40 mph advisory signs installed. Two replacement "slow down", double sided signs have been installed between the bend and crossroads and paid for by Cllr Paraskos. Following a question from Cllr Tomlinson, Cllr Paraskos advised that the cost of installing a roundabout instead of the A59 crossroads, would be in the region of £1m.
