Minutes of the Moor Monkton Parish Meeting held in the Old Schoolroom, Moor Monkton on Tuesday, 30 August 2016

The Parish Council Chairman, Councillor Ann Johnson, being present, presided over the the meeting. The Clerk, James Mackman, took the minutes. The Chairman welcomed everyone to the Annual Parish meeting. Seventeen residents were present and signed the Attendance Register.

1. MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING HELD ON 29 APRIL 2015

Prior to the meeting the Clerk had handed out the minutes of the meeting held on 29 April 2015. They were accepted as a true record of what took place and were signed by the Chairman.

5. PRESENTATION OF THE PARISH COUNCIL'S FINANCIAL REPORT

The Clerk had handed out an unaudited Receipts and Payments Account for the year ended 31 March 2016 prior to the meeting. He gave an explanation of the items of income and expenditure shown in the report which is attached to these minutes.

6. OPEN FORUM - AN OPPORTUNITY FOR RESIDENTS TO PUT FORWARD IDEAS AND SUGGESTIONS FOR THE PARISH

- A comment was made on the quality of the verge cutting. It was felt that there had been a poor result. Councillor Asquith agreed to speak with a local farmer who cuts his grass regularly and may be willing to do the job for the Parish Council.
- There was a query as to the address that the Borough Council uses for post intended for the Schoolroom. It was thought that the Borough had the Schoolroom located in Church Lane and not Main Street.

Steve Barnes gave an explanation regarding the proposed electricity supply to Queen Ethelbergas. It was feared that the road in the village would be damaged by the laying of a cable.
