Minutes of the Moor Monkton Parish Meeting held in the Old Schoolroom, Moor Monkton on Wednesday, 26 April 2017

1. MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING HELD ON 30 AUGUST 2016

4. PARISH COUNCILLORS' ATTENDANCE RECORD

Prior to the meeting the Clerk had distributed a schedule showing the possible and actual attendance of Parish Councillors at all the meetings during the previous year. There were no comments on the statistics.

5. PRESENTATION OF THE PARISH COUNCIL'S FINANCIAL REPORT

The Clerk had handed out an unaudited Receipts and Payments Account for the year ended 31 March 2017 prior to the meeting. He gave an explanation of the items of income and expenditure shown in the report which is attached to these minutes.

6. OPEN FORUM AN OPPORTUNITY FOR RESIDENTS TO PUT FORWARD IDEAS AND SUGGESTIONS FOR THE PARISH

It was suggested that the grass verges in Church Lane be cut four times per year
There was a complaint about the drivers who speed around the corner in Church Lane
There was a suggestion that there should be a petition for the introduction of a 40mph limit on the section of the A59 that runs past the end of Church Lane.
It was agreed that a resident would monitor the defibrillator on the Richard Kay Hall every week.
